NITI Aayog or National Institution for Transforming India Aayog is a policy think-tank of Government of India that replaces Planning Commission and aims to involve the states in economic policy-making in India. It will be providing strategic and technical advice to the central and the state governments i.e by adopting bottom-up approach rather than traditional topdown approach as in planning commission.

The Prime Minister heads the Aayog as its chairperson. While the Planning Commission had no representation for State and Union territories, the NITI

Union Government of India had announced formation of NITI Aayog on 1 January 2015. The first meeting of NITI Aayog was held on 8th February 2015.

NITI Aayog will seek to provide a critical directional and strategic input into the development

The NITI Aayog will develop mechanisms to formulate credible plans to the village level and aggregate these progressively at higher levels of government. It will ensure special attention to the sections of society that may be at risk of not benefitting adequately from economic progress.

India's first Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru, a socialist who admired Joseph Stalin's drive to industrialize the Soviet Union, set up and chaired the Commission to map out a development path for India's agrarian economy.

The scheme provides a life cover of INR 2 lakh to the insured in case of any type of death before the age of 55 yearsm against a minimal yearly premium of INR 330. The other scheme PMJSY, for INR 12 per annum provides accidental death coverage of INR 2 lakh and a permanent disability compensation of upto 2 lakh for any citizen between 18 years
